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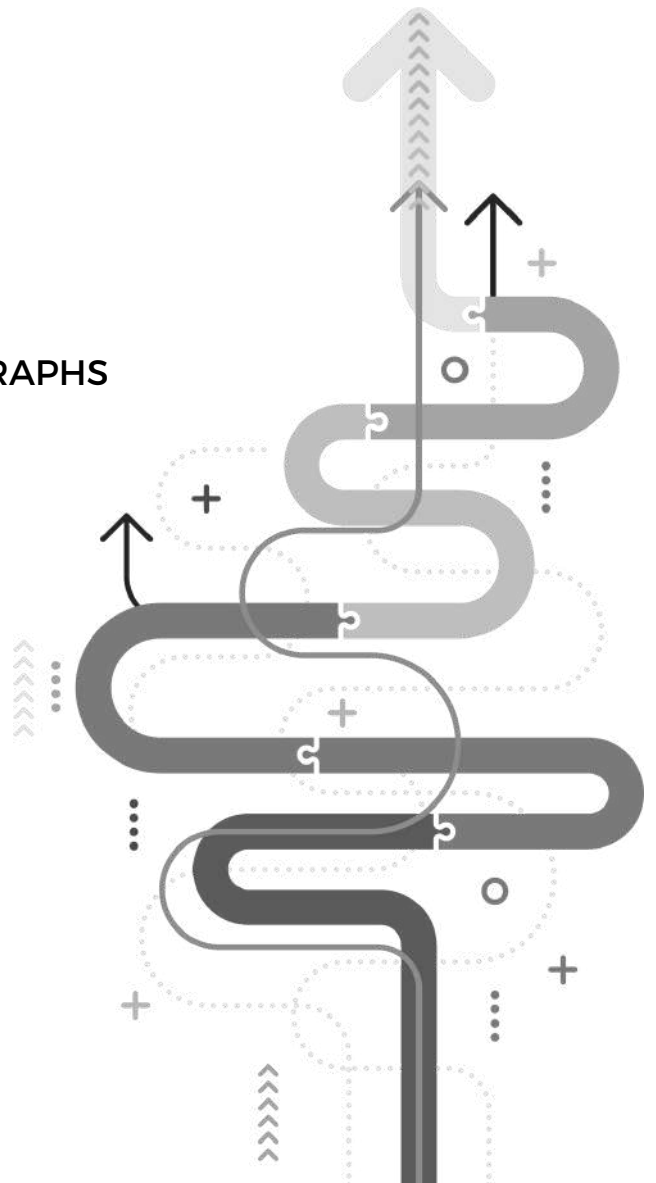
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EDITORIAL

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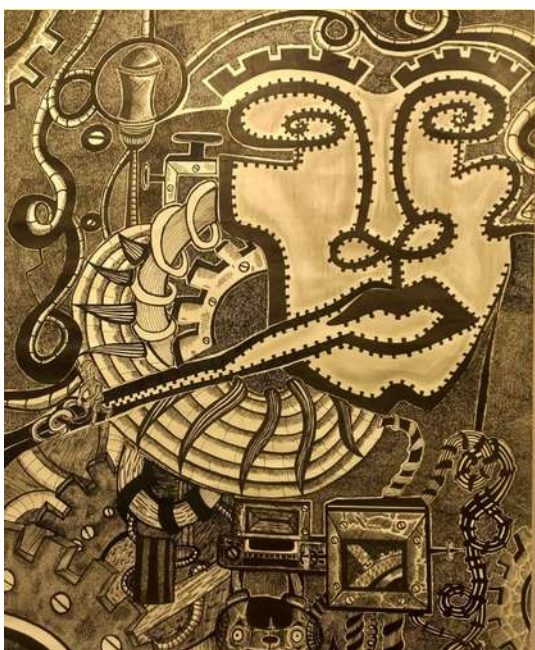
STUDENT ACHIEVEMENTS

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WHAT'S NEW AT TABIS?

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Junior Section



Arts-Based Therapy (ABT) is the evidence based use of art forms to accomplish individualised goals within a therapeutic relationship. The basis of ABT lies in Indian Psychology and Ethics, Studies of Human Development and Cognitive Neuroscience. Using different modalities of expression such as Visual Arts, Drama and Music, an individual goes through a process of gaining a better understanding of oneself. In ABT sessions, the students go through various activities such as drama, storytelling, drawing, painting, scribbling, playing instruments and so on. These activities help them to express themselves and their ideas without having to put them into words. Several domains such as attention, cognitive development, body (fine and gross motor skills), socialisation and group interaction are kept in mind while planning and executing the activities. Some of the activities are also tailored to meet the needs and capabilities of each child.

Behavior Therapy: In the realm of behavior therapy sessions at the Junior School level, the focus extends beyond conventional approaches. The sessions are intricately designed to cater to the unique needs of neurodivergent children, including those on the autism spectrum, ADHD, learning disabilities, and cerebral palsy. Employing evidence-based strategies, a supportive environment that nurtures emotional growth and cognitive development is created. Through a blend of play therapy, cognitive-behavioral techniques, and social skills interventions, the sessions aim to empower students on their individual journey. The therapeutic process is finely tuned to address behavioral challenges, enhance communication skills, and promote positive interactions in both academic and social settings. In this dynamic and empathetic setting, we witness remarkable progress, celebrating the unique strengths of every child. The integration of behaviour therapy not only shapes their present experiences but also lays a foundation for a future marked by resilience and self-confidence. As we navigate these sessions, TABIS stands dedicated to nurturing the potential of students, fostering an inclusive and compassionate learning environment.

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WHAT'S NEW AT TABIS?

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Senior Section

Functional Math

At TABIS, emphasis is placed on the day-to-day application of Math. This year, therefore, a 20% practical component was introduced where students were asked to divide pizzas, purchase articles and calculate change received, convert currencies, read time and calculate flight arrival and departure times based on their theoretical knowledge of fractions, decimals, number line, integers, etc. This made these abstract concepts more tangible, relatable and fun for our students.

Baking Practical

Baking was introduced as a mandatory vocational subject by the NIOS Board. To enhance their understanding of the subject in terms of techniques, equipment & ingredients, 60% of this subject was tested in a practical way. The students found this take on the subject extremely engaging and interesting.



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WHAT'S NEW AT TABIS?

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Senior Section

Knowledge Sharing

The process of learning is an on-going one. During the year, several Knowledge Sharing sessions were conducted by students, teachers and our school counsellor. Various topics like Fire Safety, ChatGPT, Conflict Management, Celebrating Neurodivergence and Reward & Punishment. Some of the information shared was new learning for us while some of it served as a refresher. Overall they wereenriching sessions.

Functional Finance

Financial Literacy is the first step to financial independence. In-keeping this rationale, we have designed an entire curriculum on Functional Finance for our college students. Here they are exposed to various basic concepts of accounting, different financial instruments, investment avenues - their advantages and disadvantages, etc. The content taught is informally tested through projects, quizzes and hands-on activities.



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OBSERVERSHIP

As a part of their Projects classes, to familiarise our students with the knowledge and inner workings of an HR organisation, the students of JCL 2 undertook a 3-day observership to Talisman HR Solutions, Mazgaon. They were accompanied by their teachers, Ms. Mahima Khetiya and Mr. Nirav Sheth, along with the Senior School coordinator, Ms. Delnaz Sinor. Here, the students were briefed on various HR operations such as entry and exit formalities, salary slip generation, Labour Law compliance. The students were assigned to research and understand the entry-exit formalities of an employee, highlight the importance and nuances of Labour Law, and the nitty-gritties of the salary breakup. Within their groups, the students came up with relevant questions for the processes assigned to them. Their findings were then presented in the form of a presentation.



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INTERACT CLUB

In the spirit of community service and social responsibility, The Aditya Birla Integrated School (TABIS) initiated its Interact Club last academic year under the support of the Rotary Club of Queens Necklace, Mumbai. Since its inception, the Interact Club at TABIS has been dedicated to engaging students in projects aimed at uplifting society and nurturing a sense of responsibility among its members. One of the club's first projects involved a newspaper drive and a lemonade sale, with proceeds used to provide essential stationary items to underprivileged children at a neighboring school. The students took a hands-on approach by visiting the school, conducting physical fitness exercises, imparting values, and even introducing mandala coloring as a therapeutic vocation for the students there. During the school carnival, the Interact Club set up a unique plant stall named "Green De La Cream." The funds generated from this initiative were directed towards purchasing sanitary pads for girls at the "Asha Kiran" day care center, which supports street children.
